

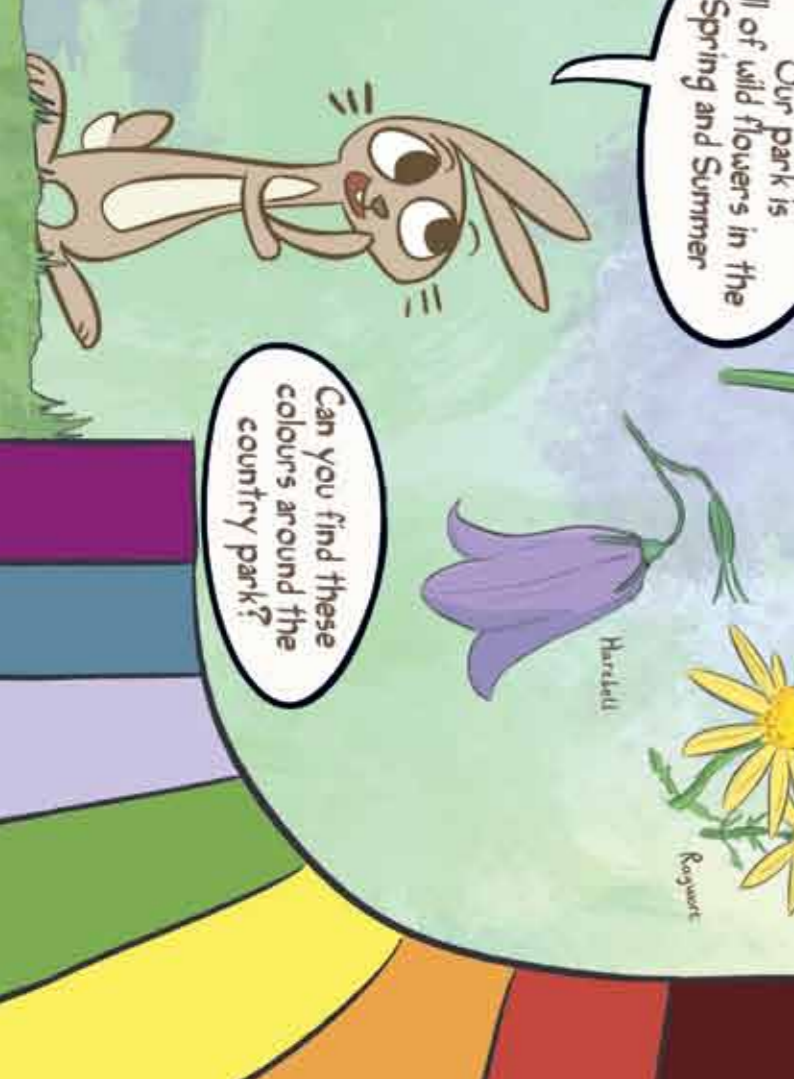


Can you see any birds nests around the park?

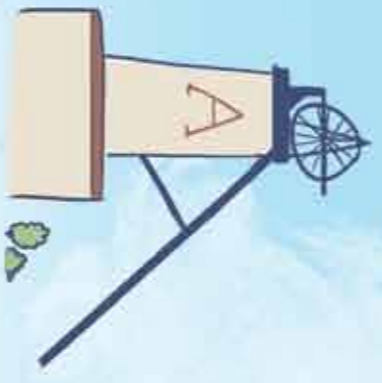

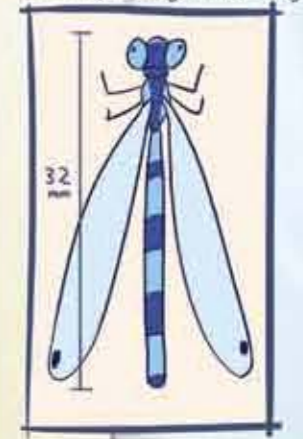
# NEWSTEAD & ANNESLEY COUNTRY PARK
